DELROY HENRY RECEIVES 12 YEAR MAXIMUM SENTENCE

Delroy Henry was sentenced this morning to the maximum sentence of 12 yrs for several counts of Securities Fraud!

Mr. Henry, a former Sgt. in the Army that served as a financial advisor to military soldiers stole over \$700,000 in a Ponzi scheme involving 96 victims. He created false portfolio summaries to perpetrate his fraud. Many victims took money out of legitimate investment funds to invest with the Defendant. Other victims took reenlistment money or increase pay for deployment and invested it with the Defendant. The victims as a result of the scheme lost college funds for their children and their retirement. Many of those victims showed up today and told Judge Samuelson of their experiences with the Defendant. Henry spent the investment money of deployed and active duty soldiers on a Jaguar, Land Rover, vacations in Hawaii, shopping sprees, an oil well, memberships to exclusive golf courses and other luxuries. The Defendant was never out on bond and has spent 359 days in custody.

“Justice was served today for men and women who are serving our country all over the world” said Sam Burney , Deputy District Attorney, Economic Crime Division.
